Copper State Classic will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the [current rulebook](#), as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating [website](#).

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules, and who are currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, a collegiate club or who is an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. Please refer to the current rulebook for non-U.S. citizens.

COVID-19 EVENT POLICIES:

EFFECTIVE MONDAY, AUGUST 2, 2021 – face coverings are required to be worn indoors by ALL persons (including fully vaccinated persons) attending any U.S. Figure Skating sanctioned event or activity despite of local, state or facility policies. Review the full update [here](#). Exceptions:

- Athletes practicing or competing on the ice.
- Warming up outside.

The Copper State Skating Club and AZ Ice Gilbert will be complying with all Federal, State and Local regulations and any additional public health notices in place at the time of the competition, including recommendations from US Figure Skating. Detailed Covid-19 protocols will be issued by the competition chair. There will be **zero tolerance** for noncompliance. In the instance there is an attendee (coach, skater, chaperone or spectator) who refuses to comply, he/she/they will be ordered to leave the facility immediately. If the noncompliance or refusal to leave the facility continues, the attendee (coach, skater, chaperone or spectator) and his/her skater will be **withdrawn from the competition**. **Properly worn face coverings** are required inside AZ Ice Gilbert, **no medical exemptions allowed**.

COVID-19 INFORMATION: (Subject to change)

- All attendees are required to properly wear face coverings, over their nose and mouth and secured under their chin, while in the facility. Exception: skaters may remove their face covering when they enter the ice, face coverings must be placed back as soon as they leave the ice. This is not only for your protection, but for the protection of others and is applied to **all** attendees.
- **Coaches:** Only one coach per skater will be permitted at rink side. Coaches must properly wear face coverings at all times while inside the facility.
- **Locker Rooms/Changing Area:** No locker rooms will be available. Be prepared to come to the rink ready to skate. Don't forget skate guards.
- A full set of Covid-19 Protocols will be available at least one week prior to Registration deadline and will be updated as needed based on Federal, State and Local regulations and any additional public health notices in place at the time of the competition, including recommendations from US Figure Skating. Please ensure that you read it prior to coming to the competition to avoid surprises.

SERIES INFORMATION: This competition is a qualifying event for the [Excel Series](#) 2022, and [National Showcase](#) 2022.



Skaters must register to participate in the Excel Series prior to competition at designated competitions in order to have their points recorded and seen in standings. Excel Series Registration is due **March 1st, 2022.**

NOTE: Solo dance events offered **ARE NOT** part of the Solo Dance Series.

Adult 1-6, adult beginner, adult high beginner, adult pre-bronze and adult bronze program/free skate events that meet Adult Competition Series guidelines are offered at this competition. Adult Competition Series participants must submit a photo, scanned copy, email attachment or screenshot of the results sheet to adultcompetitionseries@gmail.com by the deadline published in the most recent [Adult Competition Series Handbook](#) to receive credit and series points.

ELIGIBILITY/TEST LEVEL:

Test Level: Competition level is the highest test passed as of the entry deadline in the discipline the skater is entering. Athletes may “skate up” to one level above that for which they qualify. Note, athletes may not skate down in any event.

Basic Skills Event Levels:

Each skater should enter events based on their skill level as of the closing date of entries.

- Snowplow Sam Through Basic Skills 1-6: Skaters must skate at the highest level passed and NO official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed, including Moves-in-the-Field or individual dances.
- Pre-Free Skate, Free Skate 1-6, Excel, and Well-Balanced Levels: Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT only one level in the same competition. Skaters may have passed the Pre-Preliminary Moves in the Field.

Singles Free Skate Events (Well-Balanced Program) have the following requirements:

- Juvenile: Girls – 12 years or younger; Boys – 13 years or younger
- Open Juvenile: Girls – 13 years or older; Boys – 14 years or older
- Intermediate must be under the age of 18
- Adults must be 21 years or older

Skaters entering pre-juvenile and lower events will be divided as closely as possible by age, should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

For Adult Events:

Age classes for all free skate and showcase events:

- Young Adult: 18 years through 20 years
- Class I: 21 years through 35 years
- Class II: 36 years through 45 years
- Class III: 46 years through 55 years



- Class IV: 56 years through 65 years
- Class V: 66 years and older

Age classes for all solo free dance and solo pattern dance events:

- Young Adult/Class I/II: 18 years through 45 years
- Class III/IV/V: 46 years and older

All age classes may be divided or combined depending on the number of entries and at the discretion of the Chief Referee and/or the competition committee.

COMPETITION REGISTRATION:

All skaters must **register** via the [EMS Competition Portal](#) with credit card only. Each transaction includes a 3% credit card fee. All entries must be complete by **11:59 PM PT on April 24th, 2022 (02:59 AM ET on April 25th, 2022)**. Skaters will not be permitted to compete until all fees have been paid.

FOREIGN SKATERS:

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition ([click here for HOW TO](#)). This can be done by choosing the "Create Account (Non-Member)" option on the [Members Only](#) login page.

PARTNERED EVENTS:

Only one partner will complete registration for the team. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. **The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.**

MANDATORY ATHLETES:

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e. synchro, dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one minor athlete must complete SafeSport training. *

Minor Athletes who turn 18 mid-season are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SafeSport compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email safesport@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

Late entries will be accepted from April 25th to May 2nd at 11:59 PM PT (May 3rd, 2022 at 2:59 AM ET) and will be subject to a \$30.00 fee.

Two entries constitute an event. Events with single entrants will be offered an exhibition or refund. Exhibition skaters will receive a medal.

Entry fees will not be refunded after the entry deadline of April 24th, 2022 at 11:59 PM PT (April 25th, 2022 at 2:59AM ET), unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals. The online processing fees are not refundable. Contested credit card charges will be issued a \$35 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

Notification of competition times will be available on EMS approximately one week after registration ends. All registered competitors will be notified via email when the schedule is published.

Skaters and coaches **must check in** at the registration table **at least 60 minutes** before their events. Any unresolved fee must be paid at this time.

SCHEDULE: Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

NOTE: Due to the Friday, May 20th Stars on Ice performance, **Friday's events will end by 4 p.m.**

FACILITIES: The competition will be held [AZ Ice Gilbert](#), 2305 E Knox Rd, Gilbert, AZ 85296. Phone (480) 503-7080. AZ Ice Gilbert is a double surface indoor rink with NHL surfaces measuring 200 ft. by 85 ft. with slightly rounded corners. **Please note the reduced competition surface for all Showcase events.** There is a snack bar and restaurant on site.

EMS MUSIC UPLOAD:

Competitors participating in events with music are required to upload their music to the [EMS Competition Portal](#) no later than **Friday May 13th, 2022 at 5:00 PM PT/Arizona time**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a **\$25 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

All music must meet the following criteria. If you have questions about what format you have, please contact your coach and get a new version of your music that meets the criteria listed below. The Music Coordinator may contact you if your music does not meet these criteria.

MUSIC CRITERIA:

- File Format: MP3
- Bit Rate: 192 kbps or higher and Sample Rate: 44,100 kHz
 - This will be verified by the music chair and they may request you upload a corrected file.
- Leaders and trailers (the silence or "dead space" before and after the actual start and end of the program music) may not exceed two (2) seconds. We prefer that there be NO leaders or trailers at all. Excessive leaders and trailers may disrupt the playing of the music during competition.

Competitors **must** also bring a copy of their competition music on CD or digital copy (if you are accepting digital back up such as on a phone or memory stick) as a backup in case of technical difficulties and must be available rink side during the competition. Only CDs (standard CD-R format only) will be accepted for backups and must be clearly marked with the competitor's name, event, and running time.

EMS PLANNED PROGRAM CONTENT (PPC) (IJS):

Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit PPC in the [EMS Competition Portal](#) no later than **Friday May 13th, 2022 at 5:00 PM PT/Arizona time**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a **\$25 late fee**. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

JUDGING SYSTEM:

The International Judging System (IJS) will be used for the following events:

- Well-Balanced Program Free Skate Events Pre-Preliminary through Senior
- Short Program Events: Intermediate through Senior
- All Excel Plus events
- Excel Juvenile – Senior events
- Adult Free Skate Events: Bronze through Masters

The 6.0 Majority Judging System will be used for all other events, **including dance events. Copper State Classic 2022 is NOT part of the Solo Dance Series.**

Showcase events will be under rule 3200, where many non-USFS officials may be used.

LIABILITY: U.S. Figure Skating, Copper State Skating Club, and AZ Ice Gilbert accept no responsibility for injury or damage sustained by any participant in this competition. This is in accordance with Rule 1600 of the official U.S. Figure Skating Rulebook.

ONSITE CHECK-IN:

The registration desk will be located in the lobby of AZ Ice Gilbert, to the right of the entrance (North Pole). It will open one hour before the first event of the day and remain open until the last event of the day. Competitors and coaches must register upon arrival and check in **at least one hour** prior to their first event.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS:

Based upon Covid-19 protocols locker rooms will not be available.

Athletes are expected to arrive to the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up etc.). Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on. Athletes with multiple events/costumes may change in public restrooms.

TEST SESSION:

A Test Session may be offered during the competition dates. Exact time/date to be determined based on final competition schedule. Please go online to <http://www.copperstateskatingclub.com> for information. Once opened, the Test Session will also be available to register online.

PRACTICE ICE:

Practice ice sessions will be available for purchase through [AZ Ice Gilbert](#) after the schedule has been finalized. Purchase instructions will be emailed to all competitors.

PHOTO/VIDEO:

Spectators are reminded that flash photography is dangerous to skaters and will be strictly prohibited. A professional photographer will be available in the awards area.

- ❖ All Basic Skills Skaters (Snowplow Sam – Free Skate 6) are encouraged to participate in group photo.
- ❖ The LOC recommends skaters from No Test and above events who have placed 1st through 4th have a group photo taken; purchase of photo is optional.
- ❖ Individual photos will be taken upon request regardless of placement.
- ❖ Personal cameras/video cameras are permitted but **may only be used to film your skater's performance for personal use**. Only battery powered video units are allowed; electrical cords, tripods (or similar devices) are not permitted.
- ❖ Professional videography for all events will be available for purchase.
- ❖ A digital photographer will also be in attendance for professional quality action shots.

NOTE: Per U.S. Figure Skating policy, photographing and/or recording of anyone other than your own skater is strictly prohibited. Please refer to the Basic Ice Usage and Skater Etiquette Information document found in the Club Resource section of Member's Only. The LOC reserves the right to deny admittance to anyone who violates this rule.

LIVESTREAM:

Livestream of the full competition will be provided by our videographer (Coronado Productions). All skaters will receive a link.

AWARDS:

Medals with ribbons will be given for all participants in 6.0 events. Awards will be given to IJS competitors for 1st through 4th place. Once results are posted, skaters receiving awards are required to report to the awards area located in the North Pole lobby wearing their costume and skates. Awards will also be given for the winners of the Showcase Skate Off (see Skate Off below).

Annual Copper State Classic Specialty Awards:

Each recipient will receive an award presented by the sponsor or competition volunteer. Awards will be presented at the awards ceremony specified on the competition schedule, unless the recipient is no longer on site, in which case it will be mailed. Additionally, each award category will be recognized with a perpetual banner displayed at AZ Ice Gilbert. Names of recipients will be added to the banners annually.

❖ **AZ Ice Gilbert Excellence Award:** For the most technically outstanding Singles Free Skating performance at the Juvenile – Senior level. (Sponsored by AZ Ice Gilbert)

❖ **Madison Defler Memorial Award:** Madison is remembered for her work ethic and pure love of skating. In her memory, this award will celebrate the most inspirational performance at the Basic 5 – Free Skate 6 level. (Sponsored by Gordon Zaft)

❖ **Leighton Accardo “This is Me” Award:** Leighton was a bright shining star, a true one-of-a-kind performer. She was a fierce competitor! She sold every program with attitude and personality. To be awarded to the skater that embodies her flare for performance. (Sponsored by The Accardo Family)

TEST CREDIT:

Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit may request their test credit forms at Registration. Please request the test credit packet as soon as results are posted and submit payment of \$10.00 to the Copper State Skating Club. Forms must be picked up at the registration desk prior to the end of competition.

IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL COACHES:

To be a credentialed coach at a sanctioned nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the compliance requirements listed below and verified by the U.S. Figure Skating.

Coach/Choreographer (domestic/non-foreign):

- ✓ Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member.
- ✓ Completed background check *(green light status)
- ✓ Must complete annual SkateSafe Training. *

- ✓ Must complete the Professional Coach/Choreographer Coaching Education Requirement (CER) through the [Professional Skaters Association \(PSA\)](#).
- ✓ Must submit proof of general liability insurance with limits of \$1 million per occurrence/ \$5 million aggregate.
- ✓ Must agree to the U.S. Figure Skating Code of Ethics. *
- ✓ Must complete three waivers: 1) Assumption of Risk, Waiver and Release and Indemnification Agreement, 2) Medical Consent and 3) Name and Likeness Release and Consent Agreement. *

Compete USA Coach:

- ✓ Must be a current full member of U.S. Figure Skating either through a member club or as an individual member OR Learn to Skate USA instructor membership
- ✓ Completed background check *(green light status) (for coaches 18 years old and over)
- ✓ If 18 years or older, must complete annual SkateSafe Training. *
 - The training will be valid for 365 days from date of completion and there is no cost for the training/certification.
- ✓ Learn to Skate USA Instructor Certification completed OR U.S. Figure Skating compliance coach (details above)

Foreign Coach/Choreographer:

- ✓ Required to present the LOC with a letter from their federation verifying they are a member in good standing.

Coaches will need to check in at the event registration desk and show a government issued photo I.D. 60 min. prior to their first event to receive a credential.

If a coach cannot provide a photo I.D. and is not on the list or cannot produce the necessary documents, he or she will not be allowed a credential. There can be no exceptions to this policy.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:



Rules and Conduct of the Competition The decision of the referee on all matters will be final. The referee, along with the competition LOC, shall have the right to exclude any person whose behavior is unruly or unsportsmanlike. Facility rules must be followed by all participants, coaches, officials, parents, and guests.

There will be a zero tolerance policy for attendees not complying with Covid-19 protocols. If they choose to not comply immediately or are a repeat offender, they will be escorted out of the competition. Coaches will lose their competition credentials and will be expelled from the remainder of the competition, skaters will be withdrawn from all their events, and chaperones/spectators will be escorted out of the competition. If they do not immediately comply, their skater will be withdrawn from the competition.

General Information

1. Skaters will be grouped by random draw and will not be seeded in this competition.
2. Short Program and Free Skate are separate events. No final rounds will be held.
3. Male skaters will be combined with female skaters in all Showcase, Compulsory and Challenge (except jumps) events in order to make an event.
4. Different levels of non-Free Skate events may be combined in order to make an event.
5. Single entries for any event will be contacted to choose an exhibition or refund.
6. Skaters must be a current registered member of USFS as a full, LTS, collegiate or individual member, in accordance with Rule 3060a.
7. USFS events are open to members of non-USFS skating associations but must provide proof of current membership in good standing and have a letter of permission from their federation allowing them to skate in the competition or are released from their federation. In addition, if skaters are entered from Canada there would also need to be a Skate Canada sanction. See Section 3060 in the current Rulebook.
8. Special Olympics Skaters must be members of USFS or State/National Special Olympics for insurance purposes.

Critiques: Critiques will be offered for levels: Open/Juvenile through Senior. You must register for your critique(s) online at the time you register for your events. The critique schedule will be posted at the registration desk on the day of competition. Critiques may be attended only by the skater and their coach and will be conducted as close to the completion of the event as reasonably possible.

Travel arrangements: Please wait until the tentative schedule is posted before finalizing travel arrangements.

SECTION 2: Events Offered and Entry Fees:

SHOWCASE EVENTS:

All Showcase Events offered will be scheduled on **Sunday, May 22, 2022**. The competition surface will measure approximately **150 ft. by 80 ft.** Although practice ice sessions will be offered for the competition, no practice ice will be conducted on the reduced surface. The area used for warm-up will be located behind the set/curtain. It will measure approximately 50 ft by 80 ft. All warm-ups will occur on the partitioned warm-up surface, with the exception of the Interpretive events, which will occur on the competition surface. Showcase events will be a special competition under rule 3200, where many non-USFS officials may be used.

INTERPRETIVE EVENTS:

- **USFS Interpretive:** The program will be a performance choreographed by the competitor, unaccompanied and unassisted, to music that is supplied by the LOC. Programs should incorporate various elements of expressive movement and skating moves, to enhance the skater's interpretation of the music, rather than technical elements. The music will be played continuously during a 30-minute off ice session in a room. The room will be attended only by the adult monitor assigned to play the music, and the competing skaters. The music will be played twice during a warm-up on full ice. After the warmup skaters will go back to the room, with no music being played. Skaters will be brought to the ice when the previous skater finishes. All competitors in an event will interpret the same music. Props are permitted but must be brought into the room prior to listening to the music and be taken to the ice only when the skater is called to perform. Props may not be brought out during warm-up. Props may not be pre-positioned on the performance surface. All USFS interpretive levels are allowed a program of 1:30 maximum.
- **Compete USA Interpretive:** A performance choreographed by the competitor, unaccompanied and unassisted, to music provided by the LOC. During the warm-up, the skaters will hear the music twice. After the warm-up, all but the first skater will be escorted to a sound-proof locker room or other area of the arena. The first skater will hear the music one more time, then perform a program to the music. As each skater performs, the next skater in line will be brought to the arena to hear the music for a third time before performing to the music. All Compete USA Interpretive levels are allowed a program of 1:00 maximum.
- **Duet/Trio & Ensemble Events:**
 - Duets/Trios: Theatrical performances by any two/three competitors. Props and scenery ARE permitted. Skaters may enter only one duet/trio, or one mini production ensemble each.
 - Mini Production Ensembles: Theatrical performances by four to seven competitors. Props and scenery ARE permitted.

SKATE OFF

In each group on Showcase Sunday (excluding interpretive), judges have the option to nominate skaters for a special award. A skater will know if he or she has been nominated if it is noted next to their name on the results sheet. The judges will be looking for outstanding performances and are free to nominate as many skaters as they wish. Nominations are based not on technical difficulty, but on theatrical performance. The

judges will look for outstanding character portrayal, interpretation of music, theatrics, emotion, entertainment value, etc.

At the end of the day, there will be six skate offs. The event levels are as follows:

- Singles
 - Compete USA
 - No-Test – Juvenile
 - Intermediate – Senior
 - Adult
- Duets/Trios
 - Basics – No Test
 - Pre-Preliminary – Senior

The skate offs will run in the order they are listed above. The skating order for the skate off will be posted shortly after the last showcase event.

It is possible for a skater to be nominated in more than one event. In this case, we ask that you prepare for the second skate off as quickly as possible, and we will do our best to leave you enough time to do so. If a skater only wishes to participate in one skate off, they may choose to do so. The skater must advise the registration table of their decision. If a skater is nominated more than once, the skater may choose the order of the programs to be skated.

Skate off awards will be presented at the awards ceremony immediately following the competition.
